Howard County 2017 Overdoses Continue to Rise

Howard County Police report overdoses so far in calendar year 2017:

• Fatal: 52*

Non-Fatal: 155

*In fatal cases, some deaths are pending autopsy results for opioids and/or other substances. Numbers may fluctuate.

• 144 Individuals die each day in the U.S. from drug overdoses

Howard County Teens Say Vaping Is a Growing Concern in Schools

Recently, HC DrugFree's staff participated in a discussion with teens about the

perceived increase in teen vaping in Howard County schools. This is a concern HC DrugFree has been hearing from Howard County parents this school year.

Teens are easy targets for marketing firms promoting that vaping is not as bad as smoking cigarettes, so daring teens hurry to experiment. However, vaping is not a good choice for your teen and many of the chemicals may lead to other life-threatening diseases.

The teens talking with us were aware that vaping is dangerous for their developing brains/bodies. Fortunately, for many Howard County teens, that awareness is enough to keep them from trying or continuing vaping and many questionable behaviors. Again, talk with the youth in your life and help them make informed decisions.

Howard County Youth - Summer Employment in Ocean City

Youth 18 years old and older might want to consider working as Public Safety Aides in Ocean City next summer. Youth 21 years old or older may want to apply to serve as a seasonal police officer with the Ocean City Police Department (OCPD).
