Attending or hosting holiday parties? Ringing in the New Year with a few drinks? Take steps to prevent drunk driving and keep us all safe this holiday season:

- Plan ahead. If you will be drinking, do not drive. Plan a safe ride home *before* the party begins.
- If someone else is drinking, take their keys and get them a safe ride home.
- If you see an impaired driver on the road, contact local law enforcement. You could save a life.
- ...And remember, do not give alcohol to anyone under 21.

...nor should any of his adorable little elves. Remember, before family and friends arrive and the holiday celebrating begins, secure your prescription and over-the-counter medications. Remove all medication from bathroom and kitchen cabinets and on top of your bedroom dressers.

#### Formaldehyde, Acrolein and Methylglyoxal: Your Teen May be Vaping These!

The Food and Drug Administration reported that **1.3 million MORE** high school youth use e-cigarettes now than in 2017. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found a **78% increase in e-cigarette use by teens** in just one year.

For many years, HC DrugFree has had a relationship with Dr. Wilson Compton, Deputy Director of the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA), and we proudly partner with NIDA on a variety of projects. Dr. Compton is being interviewed by many media outlets this week and discussing that **1/3 of high school seniors** report using a vaping product. Students claim they are vaping *"just flavoring"* and don't know there are exposed to other chemicals.

While cigarette use has declined because we've taught our children about the many dangers, now our Howard County youth need us to educate ourselves <u>and them</u> about the dangers of e-cigarettes, Juuls, and all vaping devices.

HC DrugFree has held 2 vaping programs this school year and created a back-toschool video to bring vaping by Howard County youth to parents' attention. We plan to offer at least one more vaping program in the spring.

Howard County parents/guardians of 9 to 14 year olds are invited to join HC DrugFree and the Howard County State's Attorney's Office for our next *Guiding Good Choices* parenting 4-week program.

Participants will learn the skills to reduced the risk that their children will use drugs. After completing the program, families will be able to: **Influence** their children to help prevent drug use and other risky behaviors. **Develop** clear family guidelines and expectations about drug use. **Teach** children how to stay out of trouble, keep their friends and still have a good time.
