MD Released 3rd Quarter Fatality Data

The Opioid Operational Command Center (OOCC) and the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) have released their report on the opioid crisis in Maryland for the third quarter of 2020. The report includes preliminary data detailing further increases in opioid and other substance-related fatalities amid the coronavirus pandemic. In addition to targeted grant funding and ongoing efforts to maintain access to treatment and recovery services, the State's response focuses on new initiatives designed to address the disproportionate impacts of the opioid crisis on minority communities. Harm Reduction in Howard County

In an attempt to lower overdose rates in Howard County, increase referrals to ancillary services and treatment programs, and offer methods to stay safe and lower risk of infection from disease for those continuing risky behaviors, the County has a new recreational vehicle (RV) to expand its harm reduction services, including HIV testing, Narcan training and safe sex supplies. The RV is located in the Health Department parking lot in Columbia and is staffed by multiple peer support specialists from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays.

The full list of services at the RV are:

- Narcan/overdose response training and kits
- Peer support staff access
- Referrals to medical services/social service agencies
- HIV, hepatitis and sexually transmitted infections testing and support services
- Safe sex supplies

- Wound care
- Harm reduction kits/safer use supplies
