Twenty three year old Athena Kan, former HC DrugFree Teen Advisory Council (TAC) member and graduate of River Hill High School and Harvard University is back in the news. She and two friends were included in Entrepreneur's article How 15 People in Their 20s Built Million-Dollar Businesses released on August 24. The three cofounders launched Dreambound in early 2020, raised \$4.3 million from investors and hired a staff of 20.

Thank you to the staff at HCPSS for allowing us to stand with you throughout the years and for caring for our children and families. Remember, what is now **HC DrugFree was started by HCPSS staff** at one high school, expanded to other schools, and eventually grew to become a nonprofit.

Last week, 20 "Don't Get Benched for Life" posters were distributed to each of the 20 Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) middle schools. Today, 32 additional posters were delivered to one of those schools after they requested posters for each classroom. Wow, that's 52 possible posters displayed in just one middle school.

This educational campaign was the direct result of focus groups with Howard County middle school students stressing how they trust their coaches. Thank you to all the coaches teaching and encouraging our kids. This campaign features Howard County high school students in 7 of 8 ads (all but the little girl wearing #7).


