Guiding Good Choices is an evidence-based, interactive prevention program that provides families with the skills and knowledge to reduce the risk that their children will use drugs and alcohol or engage in other dangerous behaviors.

This series of five Zoom classes is for parents/guardians of

9-14 year olds. If your child isn't 9-14 or you are a Howard County grandparent, please register and HC DrugFree will contact you. Parents/guardians or child must live in Howard County.

Topics include How to Prevent Drug Use in Your Family, How to Develop Healthy Beliefs and Clear Standards, Avoiding Trouble: How to Say No to Drugs, Managing Conflict: How to Control and Express Your Anger Constructively, and How to Strengthening Family Bonds.

Classes will be held Wednesdays, February 2, 9, 16, 23 and March 2 from 10:30 a.m. to noon. Adults are expected to attend all 5 sessions.

## Life Skills for Grades 6-9: Register Now!

HC DrugFree is providing a highly interactive skills-based program designed to promote positive health and personal development for youth in grades 6-8. (For slightly younger or older students, we will consider each request.) We encourage siblings and friends to take these classes together!

This middle school program uses developmentally appropriate, collaborative learning strategies to help students achieve competency in the skills that have been shown to help students resist substance use (tobacco, alcohol and other drugs), violence, and other high-risk behaviors.

To be sure your student receives numerous perspectives, our instructional team consists of dedicated adults and older students sharing situations they may face in high school, college, and beyond.

Classes will be held via Zoom Tuesdays February 8, 15, 22, and March 1, 8, 15, 22, 29 from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Do you know a **college student** considering a career in public health, education, drug & alcohol prevention, or who is interested in learning more about the inner workings of nonprofit organizations?


