



Medication Storage/Disposal

HC DrugFree's twice-a-year drive-thru medication and sharps disposal event, in conjunction with the DEA's National Drug Take Back Day, will take place on **Saturday October 28 from 10** a.m. - 2 p.m. in the Wilde Lake Village Center Parking Lot (next to Slayton House and the CA Swim Center.)

Clean out your medicine cabinets and bring us your prescription and overthe-counter meds, as well as vitamins,



pet medication, vape devices, inhalers, needles, syringes, EpiPens and more!

Medications will be guarded and transported by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and the Howard County Police Department.
