On Friday, September 1, 2023, Governor Wes Moore proclaimed September as Recovery Month in Maryland. "Recovery is a journey, one that can be long and hard. It takes one's own determination and a village inclusive of family, friends, community, medical and behavioral health professionals, and peers to navigate through that journey. This critical network comprises the foundation of recovery work," said Maryland Department of Health Deputy Secretary for Behavioral Health Alyssa Lord. "Individually and collectively, these individuals offer the empathy and understanding that is essential to successfully support people wherever they are on their recovery path."
